

Shadow

Recently, I've been thinking about that place in the Lord where I can run to for protection and rest. Many times in my life I have been in that awesome place abiding under His shadow. I encourage each of you to run as fast as you can to that secret place and abide there day and night. It is the only safe place to be in on this side of heaven!

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
